Bloodspinner




These gentle spiders only ask for a pittance of blood in exchange for beautiful, sanguine weavings.

Wooliemite




Wooliemites wear wonderful

Bumblerbeetle




Nothing is more fulfilling to the bumblerbeetle than bashing its armored head against surfaces

Jacqueline




They are indeed bugs.

Squirrel




Considered bugs as they grow from squishy larval forms, squirrels predate on every kind of bug besides themselves

Green Zipper




Typically seen as a flash of emerald green and amber, these speedy creatures are always racing around

Moonwing




Nocturnal moths which have an affinity for the moon and stars. They can easily be found in observatories
